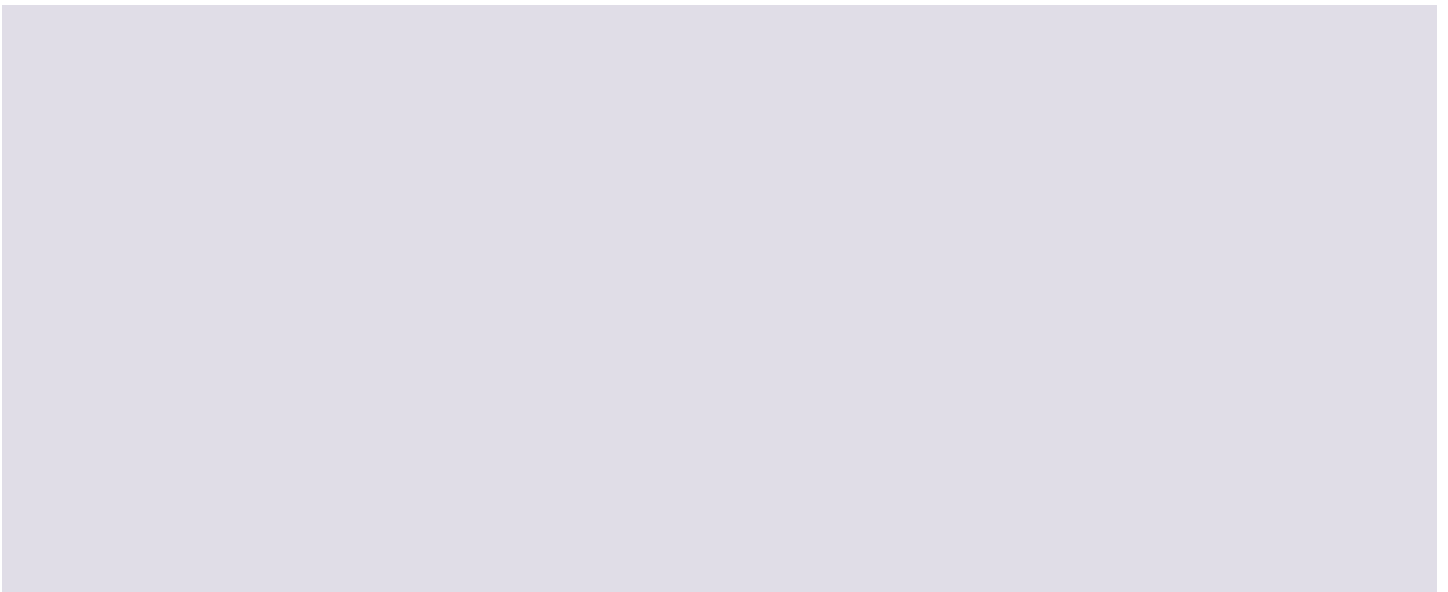
NOVEL PRESENTATION OF ABSTRACTION EXPLORED IN RAY PARKER PAINTINGS

An excellent guide to his abstract expressionism, Parker (1922-1990) is introduced by Carloline Parker in his book.

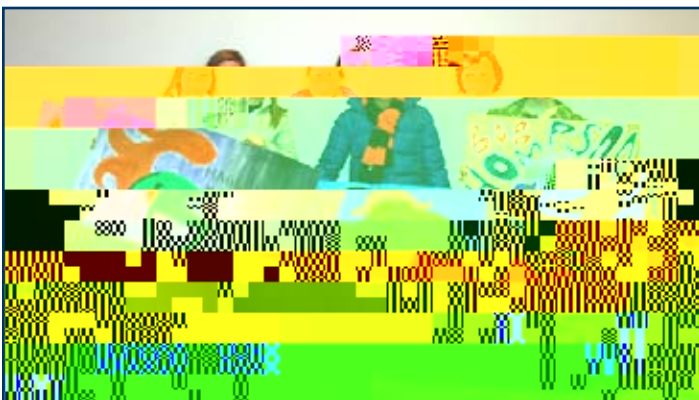
